- 4. Promotion to the rank of Professor requires strong justification without the doctorate

- 3. Superior teaching and noteworthy achievement in at least one other area of outstanding service, academic achievement, and professional development
- 4. No more than 7 years at the rank of Asst. Prof. or higher at the institution
- 5. Can be at one institution no more than 10 years at the combined rank of Instructor and Assistant Professor
